MEDIA ACCESS

CREDENTIALS:

Media (M) credentials are issued to written press, including newspapers, magazines, wire services, radio and internet journalists. Credentials noted as Valid All Sessions are valid from the first day of qualifying through the final day of the tournament. Dated credentials are only valid on the date(s) listed.

CREDENTIALS MUST BE DISPLAYED VISIBLY AT ALL TIMES. The placement of pins and other items on credentials is NOT PERMITTED.

You may not transfer your credential to anyone. Guests without credentials are not permitted in any of the media areas.

ANY MISUSE OF YOUR CREDENTIAL WILL RESULT IN ITS CONFISCATION AND SUSPENSION OF ALL CREDENTIAL ACCESS FOR THIS YEAR'S EVENT AND POSSIBLE FUTURE TOURNAMENTS.

Media credentials are distributed in the credential office located near the players entrance, just north of the West Gate. To pick up credentials, enter the site off of Miles Avenue at Gate 7, and ask for the Credential Office. There is a 10 minute parking area. Once you have picked up your credential you will be directed to your appropriate parking lot.

Credentials may be picked up from 8:00 a.m. — 9:00 p.m., March 7, 2016 through March 18, 2016 and from 9:00 a.m. – 4:00pm March 19, 2016. The office will close on March 20, 2016 after the first set of the men's final.

PARKING:

If you have been issued an "M" parking pass you will enter the site off of Miles Avenue at Gate 7 and proceed to the "M" parking lot, which is located just past the Shipping / Receiving entrance.

If you have been issued a "J" parking pass you will enter off Fred Waring at the Southwest Community Church. During the dates of March 4 – 7 the "J" lot may overflow into an off-site parking lot which is located at the corner of Highway 111 and Miles Avenue. If you are parked in this off-site parking lot shuttle service will be provided from the remote lot to the West Gate Entrance.

All Media will enter the site through the West Gate Entrance. Please note that you will not be permitted entry through the Shipping/Receiving Gate.

MEDIA WORK ROOM ACCESS:

Only media (M), photographers/local television (P), broadcast rights holders (MB), media guests and select tournament management credentials are allowed in the media work rooms.

The media work room is located in the Xerox Media Center, on the second floor of Stadium 1. The work room is equipped with lockers and pre-assigned, individual work stations. Each work station has a storage drawer, a phone jack, and a monitor for viewing matches, interviews and statistics. The BNP Paribas Open provides Ethernet connections at each work station and free Wi-Fi.

It is the responsibility of each media member to safeguard his or her own property. The BNP Paribas Open and the Indian Wells Tennis Garden are not responsible for the theft or loss of personal property. If provided with keys to any doors, locks or desks, it is the individual's responsibility to see that they are protected from loss, theft or duplication. Any loss of keys should be reported immediately. All keys MUST be returned at the conclusion of the tournament.



STADIUM SEATING

Stadium 1

• There is seating for media outside the media workroom on the balcony. In addition, there are seats in the lower bowl of Stadium 1, Section 172, Row N, Seats 1-10, and Row M, Seats 1-3. Media requesting to sit in the lower bowl need to see the Media Volunteers to secure a ticket for the session they are looking to attend. Priority will be given to deadline media. If a patron is sitting in these seats, please ask them to move. If they are not compliant, see an usher to assist with securing the seat. Media seating in each section is one seat per person; members of the media may NOT invite guests to sit in any of the media seating sections.

Stadium 2

• General media seating is located in Sections 222, Row H, Seats 1-8. The seats are ticketed by MATCH, and reserved for Media (M). Media should ask the Media Volunteers for tickets to the MATCH they are interested in attending. Priority will be given to deadline media. If a patron is sitting in these seats, please ask them to move. If they are not compliant, see an usher to assist with securing the seat.

Stadium 3 & 4

• General media seating is available in Row A, Seats 9-16 on the east side of Stadiums 3 and 4. These seats are NOT ticketed. Media (M) credentials are required to access these seats. If a patron is sitting in these seats, please ask them to move. If they are not compliant, see an usher to assist with securing the seat.

Stadium 5-9

• There are not any reserved media seats in these stadiums. It is general seating and you may take any seat available.

PLAYER LOUNGEACCESS:

Access to the player lounge is reserved for members of ITWA. Photographs or video footage of any kind is prohibited in the player lounge at all times, and applies to the use of any equipment having the capability of capturing photo or video images (including, but not limited to, mobile phones). Please do not remain in this area if you are not conducting an interview or trying to find a player.

PLAYER LOCKER ROOMS:

Media does not have access to the player locker rooms, or practice court desk area.



PHOTOGRAPHER GUIDELINES

ACCESS:

Photo (P) credentials are issued to still photographers and local television personnel. Credentials noted as valid all sessions are valid from the first day of qualifying through the final day of the tournament. Dated credentials are only valid on the date(s) listed. Only still photographers (P) are credentialed to take photographs during the tournament.

CREDENTIALS MUST BE DISPLAYED VISIBLY AT ALL TIMES. The placement of pins and other items on credentials is NOT PERMITTED.

You may not transfer your credential to anyone. Guests without credentials are not permitted in any of the media areas.

ANY MISUSE OF YOUR CREDENTIAL WILL RESULT IN ITS CONFISCATION AND SUSPENSION OF ALL CREDENTIAL ACCESS FOR THIS YEAR'S EVENT AND POSSIBLE FUTURE TOURNAMENTS.

Media credentials are distributed in the credential office located near the players entrance, just east of the West Gate. To pick up credentials, enter the site off of Miles Avenue at Gate 7, and ask for the Credential Office. There is a 10 minute parking area. Once you have picked up your credential you will be directed to your appropriate parking lot.

Credentials may be picked up from 8:00 a.m. — 9:00 p.m., March 7, 2016 through March 18, 2016 and from 9:00 a.m. – 4:00pm March 19, 2016. The office will close on March 20, 2016 after the first set of the men's final.

PARKING:

If you have been issued an "M" parking pass you will enter the site off of Miles Avenue at Gate 7 and proceed to the "M" parking lot which is located just past the Shipping / Receiving entrance.

If you have been issued a "J" parking pass you will enter off Fred Waring at the Southwest Community Church. During the dates of March 7 – 10 the "J" lot may overflow into an off-site parking lot which is located at the corner of Highway 111 and Miles Avenue. If you are parked in this off-site parking lot shuttle service will be provided from the remote lot to the West Gate Entrance.

All Media will enter the site through the West Gate Entrance. Please note that you will not be permitted entry through the Shipping / Receiving Gate.

PHOTOGRAPHY RULES AND REGULATIONS:

GENERAL

- 1. **Access** Photographers must enter and exit photo pits through approved access points only (see following pages). Still photographers issued a "P" credential may access the photo pits. Videographers/Television personnel issued a "P" credential may NOT shoot video from the photo pits. If you have been issued an "MB" credential as a broadcast rights-holder, you may shoot video from the photo pits.
- 2. **Players** Photographers are NOT ALLOWED to speak to any player at any time during a match, even when spoken to. Off court, photographers must be considerate of the players and respect their privacy.



- **3. Court officials** Photographers must not obstruct or make remarks to the court officials. Requests made by the chair umpire MUST be obeyed. Please go to the BNP Paribas Open media room if you have any questions about ball persons.
- **4. Television cameras** Photographers should avoid obstructing television cameras during live transmission.
- 5. Clothing Photographers are prohibited from wearing/carrying obvious promotional or advertising material.
- **6. Movement** Photographers must avoid unnecessary or excessive movement during play. Movement to and from positions must take place only during changeovers. PHOTOGRAPHERS MAY NOT WALK ON THE COURT AT ANY TIME, except for assigned positions during trophy presentations and during other select presentations as determined by the BNP Paribas Open.
- 7. Flash equipment Photographers MAY NOT USE FLASH EQUIPMENT before or during play.
- **8. Motor drives** If the chair umpire per request by a player asks a photographer not to use a motor drive, that photographer must obey the umpire's request
- 9. **Practice courts** Photographers are allowed to shoot Practice Courts, but may not enter onto any of the courts, or obstruct the view of patrons. If a player asks a photographer to move away from the practice, they must do so without argument.
- **10. Photo Locker Room** Located adjacent to the media lobby is the photographers locker room. Please see the media volunteers to secure a lock and locker for the duration of your stay at the tournament. There are also men's and women's restrooms in the locker room, which also contain showers. Towels are not provided by the tournament should you wish to use this feature.
- 11. Interview Rooms Photographers are required to remain on the sides of Interview Room 1 unless otherwise directed by the BNP Paribas Open. Only photographers may shoot in the interview rooms and only professional photography equipment may be used. At no time can MEDIA/PHOTOGRAPHERS take personal pictures or use cell phones/small digital cameras to take pictures. At no time can handheld video recording devices be used. All TV cameras must be on the back TV platform in Interview Room 1 and may not move around the room.



PHOTO GUIDELINES

STADIUM 1

- Photographers may shoot from either of the designated "Photo Pits" on the west or east side of the court.
 While in the pit, photographers must remain seated on the bench provided, or may lean against the ledge above. The pit is a working area and is for photographers actively shooting match action or other on-court activity.
- To access the West Photo Pit, enter concourse from media lobby, and then enter stadium through Gate 4. Media must wait for a changeover or other prolonged stoppage in play. Access photo pit via section 141 142 on the west side of court. Photographers must be in place in the pit at the start of play and may not enter or leave the pit until the following changeover.
- To access the East Photo Pit, enter stadium through Gate 1 and then to sections 103 104 or 186 185. To access the East Photo Pit from the West Photo Pit, enter the players' tunnel, turn right and exit around the flower box into the Northeast Photo Pit. This is the ONLY instance where photographers are allowed on the actual court.
- To get to the Southeast Photo Pit from the Northeast Photo Pit, photographers MUST go up to the concourse level via section 186 185 and come back down section 103 104. They may NOT access either photo pit by stepping onto the court. Do not cross the court at any time during a match (including changeovers). Your cooperation in this matter is greatly appreciated.
- As space allows, a photographer may shoot from the "flower beds" located in the opposite corners of the court surface. Please limit your time in the beds to no more than two changeovers.
- Photographers may shoot from along the wall on the concourse level below the Stadium Suites, provided
 they remain directly along the wall and do not interfere with traffic flow. Please be respectful of ticket
 holders and do not block their view.
- Camera Pad at South end of Main Stadium: No more than two photographers (1 on either side of TV camera) are allowed in this area. Photographers MUST stand against the concrete wall while shooting. Photographers are not permitted to remain in this area for more than two changeovers. Please be respectful of ticket holders, especially the patrons sitting directly behind this area.
- For any other shooting positions (e.g., media or stadium seating) please see a Media Center representative.
- Videographers must receive clearance from BNP Paribas Open media representative Matt Van Tuinen to shoot tennis action or other on-court activities from positions on the concourse level or below the Stadium Suites. Designated areas will be assigned so as not to interfere with walking traffic or spectator viewing.

STADIUM 2

- Photographers may enter through any gate; however Gate G (SW corner) will be closest to the Media Center.
- Photographers may shoot from either of the designated "Photo Pits" on the west or east side of the court, but must wait for a changeover or other prolonged stoppage in play in order to enter or exit the photo pits. While in the pit, photographers must remain seated on the bench/chairs provided, or may lean against the ledge above. The pit is a working area and is for photographers actively shooting match action or other oncourt activity.



- To access the West Photo Pit, media must enter the stadium and proceed to section 224-225 (SW corner), walk down to section 121, and then go down the stairs into the pit. In addition, they can enter at section 202-203 (NW corner), walk down to section 102, and then go down the stairs into the pit.
- To access the East Photo Pit, media enter the stadium and proceed to section 215-216 (SE corner), walk down to section 113, and then go down the stairs into the pit. In addition, they can enter at section 211-212 (NE corner), walk down to section 110, and then go down into the pit. The Northeast corner of this pit will be a shared space with the ball kids. Please be respectful of their space, and we will request the same of them.
- Photographers may not cross the court at any time during a match (including changeovers). In order to
 move from West to East, or vice versa, photographers must go up to the concourse level, and proceed to an
 indicated section above, before descending into the respective photo pit. Your cooperation in this matter is
 greatly appreciated.
- Photographers may shoot from along the wall on the concourse level between the 100 and 200 level sections, provided they remain directly along the wall/green screen and do not interfere with traffic flow or impede the view of ticket holders.
- Photographers and local TV stations may utilize section 220, row H, as an alternate shooting location. This is
 the Camera Two position for broadcast television. At this time, only one person may shoot from this
 location at a time. Please limit your time in the beds to no more than two changeovers.
- Throughout Stadium 2, row H can be utilized to shoot from, provided that you are not impeding a spectators view or access to the ticketed seats.

STADIUM 3 & 4

- Photographers may shoot between the service lines in the photo pit on the west side of each Stadium. Please enter and exit these courts on changeovers only. There are eight chairs designated for photographers in this location.
- If you wish to shoot on the east side of the court, you may stand against the green screen on the concourse between the lower and upper levels of the Stadiums.
- Photographers must wait for changeovers to access the courts, but may enter from the 'exit' side.

STADIUM 5

Photographers may shoot on the concrete walkway on the east side of the court between the service lines or
on the west side against the green screen on the concourse level.

STADIUM 6

• Photographers may shoot on court in the niche on the west side of the court and from the green screen on the concourse level on the east side of the court.

STADIUMS 7, 8, & 9

• Photographers may shoot from the green screens on east and west sides of the court on the concourse level.



TV NON-RIGHTS HOLDER GUIDELINES

FILMING RESTRICTIONS:

Domestic Television Non-Rights Holders (P), outside of local Palm Springs television affiliates, **cannot** film any match footage on-site. You can film around the grounds and practice. Television non-rights holders can film player interviews conducted in Interview Room 1 from the camera platform, and Interview Room 2 (back of the room). You can also request and film player one-on-one interviews. The media staff will assist with allocating a location for these interviews.

Print Media (M) who wish to record a report on video to be published on their outlet's website can do so provided they do not film any match footage or practice footage on-site. The media staff will assist with allocating a location for these interviews. You are responsible for providing your own equipment.

INTERNET MEDIA GUIDELINES

INTERNET/WEBSITE MEDIA RULES AND REGULATIONS:

Website media personnel accredited at the BNP Paribas Open are those who contribute written copy to a publication or organization which has been granted accreditation.

- 1. **Non-accredited websites.** Accredited media may only contribute to the website of the publication to which they were accredited.
 - A. Accredited media may NOT contribute to a website which has not been accredited.
 - B. Accredited media may not furnish reports to any unofficial website devoted substantially to the BNP Paribas Open or whose name includes "BNP Paribas Open."
- 2. **Still photographs.** No still photographs from the official BNP Paribas Open website or social media channels (Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, etc.) may be reproduced on any other website without the permission of the copyright holder. The BNP Paribas Open recognizes that you may wish to reproduce your own photographs taken at the tournament or to reproduce wire agency photos. **Note:** Only photographers (P) are credentialed to take photographs during the tournament.
- 3. **Point-by-point scores.** No live point-by-point scores may be transmitted over the Internet except through the official BNP Paribas Open website. The right to transmit live scores and results is the exclusive property of the BNP Paribas Open, unless covered by a separate license granted by the BNP Paribas Open.
- 4. **Player interviews.** Internet organizations may request one-on-one interviews for print only. If granted the interview, it **may not** be filmed. Player transcripts can only be posted on the website of the publication for which you were accredited.



INTERVIEW ROOMS

Two interview rooms (1 and 2) are located outside the media work room. Each interview room has molt boxes for radio and TV. Players will be escorted to one of the interview rooms at designated times after their matches.

All interviews in Interview Room 1 may be viewed live on monitors at the individual work stations in the media work rooms.

Photographers are required to remain on the sides of Interview Room 1 unless otherwise directed by BNP Paribas Open media attendants. Only photographers may shoot in the interview rooms and only professional photography equipment may be used. At no time can MEDIA/PHOTOGRAPHERS take personal pictures or use cell phones/small digital cameras to take pictures. At no time can handheld video recording devices be used. All TV cameras must be on the back TV platform in Interview Room One and may not move around the room.

ASAP Sports will provide transcripts of the interviews conducted in Interview Room 1, and they can either be emailed to accredited journalists, or hard copies will be printed and available in the media work room. Transcripts and video of player interviews will be posted to BNPParibasOpen.com and the tournament's YouTube channel, at approximately 10:00 a.m. the day following when the press conference took place.

Only (M), (P), (MB) and select tournament management credentials are permitted in the interview rooms. Only working media are allowed to ask players questions in an official press conference.

All media are encouraged to submit their one-on-one interview requests before the start of play each day. If a player has not been requested for a post-match interview by the conclusion of his or her match, that player is not obligated to grant an interview the same day. All one-on-one interviews with players must be officially requested from the WTA and ATP World Tour staffs.

MEDIA DINING

DINING:

Media dining access is located in two areas: player/media dining and concessions. Media with orange credentials and blue credentials (ITWA) will have access to player/media dining, located outside the media lobby. Media with a brown credential badge will use the concessions area. The dining room is open for breakfast, lunch and dinner to select credentialed media and tournament personnel, while the concessions area is open for day and evening sessions. A daily allotment of money has been added to each media credential, and the bar code will be scanned as payment for dining options. The daily allotment does not roll over to the next day.

NOTE: Complimentary filtered water is provided for the media in the media work rooms.

As a reminder, at NO TIME should a credentialed media member ask for a player to sign an autograph.



TOURNAMENT INFORMATION

STATISTICS AND RESULTS:

Statistics are available for all major singles matches taking place during the BNP Paribas Open. They are printed by the media volunteers and are on file behind the media volunteer desk. If a certain match is not available, please request this from the volunteers.

SERVICES



TELEPHONES:

Phones are available upon request for use at each desk in the media workroom. Each workstation has a local line and phone number. Please do not use any work station phone unless you have been given permission to do so.

FIRST AID:

There are two first aid stations at the Indian Wells Tennis Garden:

- 1. Outside of Stadium 1, near Entry D
- 2. Outside of Stadium 2, near Entry G

LOST & FOUND:

Lost and Found is located in Stadium 2 at Entry G on the East side. The Indian Wells Tennis Garden, its owner and the owner's affiliates, agents and employees are not responsible for lost or stolen articles.

RESTROOMS:

Men's and women's restrooms are located outside of the main media work room and in the photo locker rooms.

MEDIA HOTELS:

The official media hotel of the BNP Paribas Open is the Holiday Inn Express (Palm Desert), which has an allocation of rooms at a discounted media rate. Media may request hotel reservations through the credential application system. Priority will be given to deadline media.

SHUTTLE INFORMATION:

The BNP Paribas Open provides a shuttle service for all media to and from the Indian Wells Tennis Garden and to various hotels in the area. A schedule and guidelines will be available onsite at the media services desk in the main media workroom. Your credential does not permit you to bring guests aboard official transportation. It provides shuttle privileges for only you. Shuttle drivers are instructed to use specific pick-up and drop-off site ONLY (the Indian Wells Tennis Garden and one or more of the official hotels). DID YOU KNOW?

- Players from 12 different countries have won the women's singles Italy, Belarus, Denmark, USA, Serbia,
 Belgium, Slovakia, Switzerland, Germany, Yugoslavia, Bulgaria and Russia, while nine different nations are
 represent winners of the men's singles USA, Serbia, Switzerland, Spain, Australia, Chile, Sweden,
 Slovakia and Germany.
- In a unique convergence of the careers of some of tennis' greats, twelve future Tennis Hall of Famers competed in the 64-player field of the 1976 tournament, including Arthur Ashe, Bjorn Borg, Jimmy Connors, Cliff Drysdale, Rod Laver, Ilie Nastase, John Newcombe, Charlie Pasarell, Tony Roche, Ken Rosewall, Stan Smith and Ion Tiriac. Connors topped Tanner for his first of three wins in the desert. That first event in 1976 boasted eight Grand Slam singles champions.
- Novak Djokovic and Roger Federer are the only four-time men's champion of the BNP Paribas Open. Djokovic's titles came in 2008, 2011, 2014 and 2015, while Federer's titles came consecutively in 2004, 2005 and 2006, and 2012. Rafael Nadal (2013, 2009, 2007), Michael Chang (1992, 1996, 1997) and Jimmy Connors (1976, 1981, 1984) are three-time winners of this event.
- The players who have won back-to-back singles titles at the event are Novak Djokovic (2014, 2015), Roger Federer (2004, 2005, 2006), Lleyton Hewitt (2002, 2003), Michael Chang (1996, 1997), Pete Sampras (1994, 1995), Boris Becker (1987, 1988) and Roscoe Tanner (1978, 1979). Only Martina Navratilova (1990, 1991) has won two straight women's crowns.
- Lisa Raymond is the most decorated doubles player in the history of the event, reaching the doubles final a record eight times and winning a record seven titles including in 2012 with Liezel Huber. On the men's side Guy Forget made it to the doubles final six times and captured five titles.
- Interestingly, ten times there have been double bagel (6-0, 6-0) score lines, twice in the men's draw eight in the women's. Lindsay Davenport has been on the winner's end of that scoreline three times against Harkleroad in 2005, Sharapova in 2005 and Santangelo in 2004.
- Three unseeded men have won the singles title. In 1985 Larry Stefanki became the first (and only "wildcard" to do so). In 1999 it was Mark Philippoussis and a year later it was Alex Corretja. In 2005, Kim Clijsters became the first and only unseeded women's champion.
- Lindsay Davenport won the singles and doubles titles in the same year twice (1997, 2000) and Vera Zvonareva achieved the elusive double-double once (2009). Jim Courier (1991), Boris Becker (1988) and Roscoe Tanner (1978) are the only three to have won both men's crowns in the same year.
- Families have played big parts over the years at the BNP Paribas Open. Here is a breakdown of those who have played: McEnroe John, Patrick, Williams Venus, Serena, Sanchez Arantxa, Emilio and Javier, Safin/Safina Marat, Dinara, Maleeva Manuela, Katerina, Maggie, Black Byron, Wayne, Cara, Gullikson Tim, Tom, Mayer Gene, Sandy, Austin Tracy, John, Strode Buzz, Charles, Serra Zanetti Adriana, Antonella, Bondarenko Alona, Kateryna, Radwanska Agnieszka, Urszula, Harrison Ryan, Christian



DID YOU KNOW?

- The BNP Paribas Open presented by the City of Indian Wells will conduct its 41st men's event and 28th women's event in 2016. The events were held on consecutive weeks from 1989 through 1995 before combining for simultaneous play in 1996. This year marks the 20th year that the men and women will compete concurrently.
- The roots of the BNP Paribas Open and professional tennis in the California desert actually extend to the Arizona desert. In 1974, the Association of Tennis Professionals (ATP) staged a tournament in Tucson, Arizona, primarily as a fund raiser for the Association. Looking to increase revenue, the ATP moved to the Coachella Valley two years later.
- The 2015 BNP Paribas Open drew a crowd of 456,672, setting a new attendance record for ATP World Tour and WTA combined events. The 2015 tournament also set a day session record of 32,354 on Saturday, March 14. The evening session attendance record was set in 2013, on the middle Saturday, March, 9, with 18,656 fans attending the session.
- The 2014 BNP Paribas Open generated more than \$373 million in economic impact for the Coachella Valley. The study, conducted by The George Washington University, showed an increase of roughly \$85 million from 2011, the last time the study was conducted, and more than \$272 million since 2001.
- The seating capacity of the Stadium Court at the Indian Wells Tennis Garden (16,100) is the second largest of any tennis-only stadium on either Tour. Only the U.S. Open's Arthur Ashe Stadium (22,500) is larger.
- Hawkeye replay technology was installed on all match courts for the 2011 event. To this day, the BNP
 Paribas Open remains the only tournament in the world, including the four Grand Slams, to have the line
 call challenge system on every match court.
- The late Alan King, a former BNP Paribas Open co-chairman, is memorialized each year when the tournament presents the Alan King Passion Award to a player. Past recipients include Andre Agassi (2005), Jack Kramer (2006), Billie Jean King (2007), Rod Laver (2008), Chris Evert (2009), Tracy Austin (2010), Stan Smith (2011), Tony Trabert (2012), Barry MacKay (2013), Bud Collins (2014), and Vic Braden (2015).
- In 2012, the BNP Paribas Open became the first non-Grand Slam tennis tournament to offer \$1 million to its singles champions, increasing total prize money to more than \$10 million.
- BNP Paribas Open CEO Ray Moore also participated as a player in the BNP Paribas Open, reaching the
 doubles final twice in the first three years of the tournament. Moore and Erik Van Dillen lost in the
 inaugural doubles championship in 1976 but Moore was victorious in 1978 with Roscoe Tanner.
- More than 1,000 volunteers representing The Champions Volunteer Foundation will devote long hours to the successful operation of the tournament. They provide support in a variety of areas, including ball kids, box office, communication, credentials, draw sheet sales, hospitality, information, media, player's desk, private housing, scorekeepers, transportation, ushers, will call, and tournament office. The Champions Volunteer Foundation represents a unique group of people coming together, donating their time to raise funds for charitable purposes including, but not limited to youth recreational, educational and well care programs.
